# Previous Chemung County Sales Tax Distribution Agreements





### Pre-2014 Sharing Formula

- The first 1% was retained by the county
- The remaining 3% was allocated as follows
  - Half was retained by the County
  - Half was distributed to municipalities based on population share



### 2014-2018 Sharing Formula

- The first 1% percent is retained by the County
- The remaining 3% was allocated as follows
  - 65.6 % retained by the County
  - The remaining 34.3 % is distributed to municipalities based on population share



# Current Sales Tax Distribution Agreement

 In November of 2018 a new formula was established and approved involving sales tax redistribution for municipalities in Chemung County

 The formula was for a (2) year period, 2019 and 2020



### 2019 – 2020 Sales Tax Distribution Percentages





### Town of Elmira

Shared service agreement with the Town of Elmira for a Highway Superintendent was reconstructed resulting in a new deal whereupon the town pays for a portion of the salary 35%, 40% and 45%
